Class attendance for the month of November 2023. Nursery is not statutory, therefore data is not included here.

Please note that we are obliged to contact the Local Authority if a pupil has unauthorised absences that equate to more than 10% within a six-week period. This route will result in a Penalty Notice (PN) being issued or a referral to Family Services.

If there is a reason for your child to be absent, for example sickness or medical appointments, please email <u>absent@academy.thomas-s.co.uk</u>. For absence requests, a form can be collected from the school office for Miss Kelly to consider.

Punctuality is also incredibly important. The classrooms open at 8.45am at which point children can enter and engage with learning activities - these tend to be maths revision and challenges to support children's retention of maths learning. The register is taken at 8.55am after which point children are marked late. School doors close at this time and children will only be able to enter via the front office.

Children should be collected promptly at the end of their school day. Any parent collecting after being 10 minutes late, their child may be sent to Shine Bright Club and parents/carers may be charged a minimum fee of £10.

Behaviour

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Above are just some of the ways children are rewarded for good behaviour at Thomas's Academy. We have made some adaptations to the ways in which we respond to unacceptable behaviour and this has been introduced to children.

For minor incidents, children will receive:

- First Reminder
- Second Reminder
- Internal Reflection (around 10 minutes) this will involve a behaviour note being sent home.

After their reflection, children will be able to join their class with the learning. If children receive three behaviour notes in one half-term, parents will be invited in for a meeting to discuss the behaviour and how we might work together to change the pattern of behaviour.

For more serious incidents, senior leaders will speak to the child involved. It is likely that parents will be contacted by Mrs James or Miss Kelly and will be invited to a meeting. The child will be given external reflection time (time out of the class).

Some children will have a personal positive behaviour plan tailored to their needs. Parents will be invited to contribute to this.

Outdoor Areas

The PTA and Parent Community have been working effortlessly to support the school with a number of exciting projects which many families would have already seen, largely focusing on the outside areas.

Current projects:

Front Playground Wooden Play Area

The wooden play structure has been completely deconstructed and work is currently underway to encase the trees and bushes that we have kept from the previous structure along with a welcoming and relaxing seating area being created as part the area. We have kept the plants that were homed in the play structure and distributed these to areas within the school.

School Garden

We have agreed a quote for a gate to be installed to the entrance of the school garden, with paving to be relaid/redistributed so all children can access areas of the garden.

Nursery front garden

The school has secured funding from XChange to renovate the nursery front playground and we are currently in process of finalising designs that can be shared with the school community.

Outdoor Toilet - Boys and Girls

We completely the first stage of renovation and have planned for the next stages to be carried out and completed before the 15th December, just in time for the Winter Fair!!




