Chickenpox

There have been a number of cases of Chickenpox at school. Please note that this is simply advice to be aware of in case your child develops symptoms.

Please see the NHS Medical Advice below.

Chickenpox is a mild and common childhood illness that most children catch at some point.

It causes a rash of red, itchy spots that turn into fluid-filled blisters. They then crust over to form scabs, which eventually drop off. Some children have only a few spots, but other children can have spots that cover their entire body. These are most likely to appear on the face, ears and scalp, under the arms, on the chest and belly, and on the arms and legs.

To prevent spreading the infection, keep children off school until all their spots have crusted over. Chickenpox is infectious from one to two days before the rash starts, until all the blisters have crusted. Please inform the school if your child has chickenpox.

If your child has chickenpox, try to keep them away from public areas to avoid contact with people who may not have had it, especially people who are at risk of serious problems, such as newborn babies and pregnant women. Chickenpox infection in pregnancy may cause more severe illness and there may be a risk to the foetus. If you are pregnant you should contact your GP who may wish to do a blood test to see if you are immune.

Chickenpox treatment

Chickenpox in children is considered a mild illness, but your child will probably feel pretty miserable and irritable while they have it.

Your child may have a fever for the first few days of the illness. The spots can be incredibly itchy. There is no specific treatment for chickenpox, but there are pharmacy remedies that can alleviate symptoms. These include paracetamol to relieve fever, and calamine lotion and cooling gels to ease itching.

When to see a doctor

Contact your GP straight away if your child develops any abnormal symptoms, such as:

- if the blisters on their skin become infected
- if your child has a pain in their chest or has difficulty breathing

January's Attendance

Class attendance for the month of January 2024. Nursery is not statutory, therefore data is not included here.

Please note that we are obliged to contact the Local Authority if a pupil has unauthorised absences that equate to more than 10% within a six-week period. This route will result in a Penalty Notice (PN) being issued or a referral to Family Services.

If there is a reason for your child to be absent, for example sickness or medical appointments, please email absent@academy.thomas-s.co.uk For absence requests, a form can be collected from the school office for Miss Kelly to consider.

Punctuality is also incredibly important. The classrooms open at 8.45am at which point children can enter and engage with learning activities - these tend to be maths revision and challenges to support children's retention of maths learning. The register is taken at 8.55am after which point children are marked late. School doors close at this time and children will only be able to enter via the front office.

Children should be collected promptly at the end of their school day. Any parent collecting after being 10 minutes late, their child may be sent to Shine Bright Club and parents/carers may be charged a minimum fee of £10.



Government campaign to improve attendance

Improving school attendance is everyone's business and, to tackle the challenge we face, we need to work together. From 8 January, Government is launching a national campaign to remind parents and carers of the importance of school attendance.

The campaign strapline is "moments matter, attendance counts". Messaging for the communications have been developed from research into parental attitudes, as well as two local authority pilots at the end of 2023.



Attendance: the top facts to know & share



The link between attendance and attainment is clear:

- In 2018/19, just 40% of persistently absent (PA) children in KS2 achieved expected KS2 standards, compared with 84% of pupils who were regular attenders.
- And 36% of PA children in KS4 got 9 to 4 in their English and maths GCSEs, also compared with 84% of regular attenders.1

And it's never too late to benefit from good attendance:

 More than half (54%) of pupils who were PA in Year 10 and then rarely absent in Year 11, passed at least 5 GCSEs, compared to 36% of pupils who were persistently absent in both years.²

But attendance is important for more than just attainment:

 Regular school attendance can facilitate positive peer relationships, which is a protective factor for mental health and wellbeing.3

Behaviour



Above are just some of the ways children are rewarded for good behaviour at Thomas's Academy. We would like to share again, the ways in which we respond to unacceptable behaviour.

For minor incidents, children will receive:

- First Reminder
- Second Reminder
- Internal Reflection (5/10 minutes) this will involve a behaviour note being sent home.



After their reflection, children will be able to join their class with the learning. If children receive three behaviour notes in one half-term, parents will be invited in for a meeting to discuss the behaviour and how we might work together to change the pattern of behaviour.

For more serious incidents, senior leaders will speak to the child involved. It is likely that parents will be contacted by Mrs James or Miss Kelly and will be invited to a meeting. The child will be given external reflection time (time out of the class).

Some children will have a personal positive behaviour plan (PBP) tailored to their needs. Parents will be invited to contribute to this.




Learn to Learn
