

What's been happening in Nursery?

October has been a wonderful and busy month in Nursery! The children have continued to settle fantastically into our daily routines and are becoming more confident and independent each day.

This month, we celebrated Black History Month, exploring inspiring stories and learning about important figures through books, music and art. The children enjoyed hands-on activities that helped them understand and appreciate diversity and inclusion.

We also learnt about Diwali, the festival of lights! The children created colourful artwork, listened to stories about the celebration and learnt about kindness, light, and togetherness. Special thanks to Emily who shared her experiences celebrating this special festival.

A big thank you to our parent volunteers who came in to read stories to the class. The children absolutely loved having you join us and share special reading moments.

In our specialist lessons, the children have really settled into PE and Art sessions. They've been developing their coordination and movement skills in PE, and exploring colours, shapes and textures creatively in Art.

We're so proud of how much everyone has grown this half term both in confidence and curiosity. We can't wait to see what next month brings!











What's been happening in Reception?

What a wonderful and busy term it has been in Reception! The children have settled beautifully into school life and have shown great enthusiasm for learning across all areas of the curriculum.

In Maths, the Reception children have been developing their early mathematical understanding through a range of fun and engaging activities. They have explored numbers and patterns, learning to count, sort, and match objects, and to recognize simple repeating patterns. The children have also investigated shape, space, and measure, comparing and ordering different items by size, length, or quantity. Through hands-on exploration, they have begun to understand the composition of numbers up to five, including one more and one fewer, and the relationships between consecutive numbers. The children have particularly enjoyed settling into their maths routines at the tables with their maths books, showing increasing confidence and independence in their learning.

Our topic work this term has been full of excitement and discovery! The children have explored themes such as Families, Pirates, and Transport, which have sparked their curiosity and imagination through creative play, stories, and hands-on experiences. In Literacy, they loved learning and retelling the story of Owl Babies using a story map to help them order and sequence the events. They also extended their learning by finding out interesting facts about real-life owls and comparing them to the characters in the story. These experiences have supported their language development, storytelling skills, and understanding of the world around them.

It has been a fantastic start to the school year, and we are so proud of how much the children have achieved already. We look forward to seeing their confidence and curiosity continue to grow next term!



What's been happening in Year 1?

What a brilliant and exciting month of learning we've had in Year 1! Children have shown great progress in all areas, particularly with their confidence, independence and resilience.

In English, our young readers and writers have been using *The Colour Monster* and colourful semantics to learn how to write simple sentences that make sense. They have enjoyed learning about verbs, nouns and adjectives and how to use these in their speech and writing. The children used their sound mats and blending strategies to have a go at spelling new words and began experimenting with capital letters and full stops. They loved using our story map and actions to retell *The Colour Monster* and were so proud to publish their very own stories, complete with beautiful handwriting and wonderful illustrations!

In Maths, our young mathematicians have been busy exploring numbers in lots of different ways. They enjoyed using manipulatives, pictures, and number bond diagrams to show different number combinations and to create number stories. The children enjoyed learning about addition within 10, using part-whole diagrams to help them understand how numbers fit together. They learned how to write addition equations to solve addition problems and have explored the idea that addition can be done in any order (*commutative property*). More recently, they've been learning about subtraction, using strategies such as crossing out, number bonds and counting back. It's been wonderful to see their confidence grow as they solve mathematical problems and use new mathematical language.

In Geography, our young explorers have been learning all about maps and their local area. They enjoyed spotting features of the school on aerial photographs and finding where they live on a map of the UK. The children created their own classroom map using objects to show distance and direction, and used maps to identify features around the school grounds.

In Science, our young scientists have been learning all about the four seasons and the different kinds of weather we experience throughout the year. They explored how the seasons affect trees, daylight hours and the clothes we choose to wear.

We are so proud of the children for continuing to adapt to their new learning in Year 1 and cannot wait to see their development continue throughout the next half term.













What's been happening in Year 2?

It's been a fantastic month of learning in Year 2!

In Maths, we've been working hard on addition and subtraction of two-digit numbers, including learning how to rename. The children have shown great perseverance and growing confidence in tackling tricky number problems.

In English, we became expert instruction writers! We began by writing instructions on how to plant seeds—and even got to plant our own. It's been so exciting watching them start to grow! Afterwards, the children chose their own "how to" topics, writing creative and detailed instructions on everything from cooking to crafts. We've all learned some new skills and even discovered some delicious new recipes!

In History, we wrapped up our topic on Schools in the Past. The children designed their own dream classrooms, combining the best parts of old-fashioned schools with the things we love about learning today. There were some very imaginative ideas!


In Science, with Ms Ayishat, we've been exploring Habitats. We've learnt all about different environments and the food chains within them. The children now understand what a producer is and how plants make their own food using sunlight.

Our handwriting is also on the up! We've started learning how to join our letters using cursive writing, practising joins like ai, ay, ee, ea, ie, and ide. We're well on our way to becoming handwriting specialists!

We also had an exciting visit from the Fire Brigade. The firefighter taught us how to stay safe if there's ever a fire at school or at home. We learned that every home should have at least one smoke detector on each floor — an important safety tip we all took home!

Year 2 have had such a busy, hands-on month full of creativity, curiosity, and growing independence. We can't vait to see what next month brings!







What's been happening in Year 3?

Year 3 have had another fantastic month of learning!

In Maths, the children have been exploring addition and subtraction with three digit numbers. Although they found renaming a little tricky at first, they persevered and showed great resilience, always remembering that "mistakes make us great!"


In Writing, the children have produced some amazing pieces of work, culminating in their very own stories inspired by The Bear and the Piano. They worked incredibly hard to include tools such as fronted adverbials, similes and expanded noun phrases.


Our History lessons have taken us back in time to the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age. The children particularly enjoyed learning how trade increased during the Iron Age and taking part in a fun trading game, which helped them understand the bartering process and what Iron Age people needed to survive.

In Science, we've been learning about movement and nutrition. The children have explored the roles of skeletons and muscles, how the body uses energy and what makes up a balanced diet. They were especially fascinated to learn about prosthetics!
















What's been happening in Year 4?

Year 4 have had such an exciting month of learning, showing huge determination across all their subjects!

In Maths, we have been diving into addition and subtraction with 4-digit numbers. The children were learning to use column addition and subtraction and showed great determination in applying these skills to solve some very tricky two-step word problems! They approached the challenges with a brilliant, resilient attitude!

In Writing, the children have been working incredibly hard at creating their own balanced arguments on a change they would like to make at school. They focused on making sure they gave both sides of their arguments and produced some powerful pieces of work, including tools such as fronted adverbials, exclamation marks, and commas in a list.

In Science, we've been learning about diet, digestion, and teeth. The children explored the different types of human and animal teeth and their connection to an animal's diet. They were particularly excited when we looked at pictures of animal poo to try and figure out what animal it was linked to, depending on their digestion and teeth!

Our History lessons have taken us on a journey through time as we learned how childhood has changed from the Tudors and Victorians to now, contrasting the aspects of daily life, education, and play across these periods.

This month, Year 4 had a bake sale to raise money for our upcoming trip. This was a huge success due to the PTA and all of the Year 4 parents who helped out!



What's been happening in Year 5?

What an amazing month of learning in Year 5!

In **Maths**, we've been deepening our understanding of written methods for addition and subtraction. Furthermore, the children have been learning how to find multiples, common factors and prime numbers - demonstrating excellent determination towards each challenge!

In **English**, we have been exploring persuasive writing. After analysing powerful examples, the children planned and wrote their own persuasive pieces on topics they feel passionate about. I was so impressed by their thoughtful arguments, emotive language and growing confidence in writing for a purpose.

Our **Science** topic this half term was **Materials**. Through hands-on investigations, we've explored filtering as well as reversing processes through evaporation. The children have really enjoyed becoming scientists and making predictions based on their understanding.

In **History**, we learnt about the **Tudors**, in particular Henry VIII's wives and how monarchs used propaganda through their paintings and Royal Progresses. Everyone enjoyed our end of unit Kahoot quiz and produced some fantastic posters (now on display) summarising our learning.

It has been a brilliant, active and inspiring month in Year 5. The children's independence, teamwork and resilience continue to shine. I am already excited to see what new challenges and achievements next month will bring!



What's been happening in Year 6?

What a great half term Year Six have had!

In **Maths**, we've been working on fractions. We have been finding common factors and multiples and learning to find common denominators to help us add and subtract fractions.

In **English**, we have been looking at the book **Can We Save The Tiger** and using it to help us write non-chronological reports and persuasive letters. We are going to post our letters to our MP, Ben Coleman (he has promised to write back!).

Our **Science** topic this half term was **Classification**. We went on a school trip to the Natural History Museum to see all the different animals. We saw fossils of dinosaurs, skeletons of enormous whales, and even got to meet a T Rex.

In **History**, we learnt about the **Census**, and how we can use it to build histories of the lives of people in our local area from the past. We also looked at historic maps and researched some forgotten features of our town.

It has been an absolute joy to start the year with such enthusiasm and positivity. Year Six have set the example at playtime, during assembly, and in our recent football competition. We are all very excited about the weeks ahead!



Art in October

What a wonderful October we have all had in Art.

Reception and Year 1 explored the beauty of spirals, inspired by artist Molly Haslund's outdoor drawings. They then experimented with water-soluble pens to create stunning shell designs, combining creativity with careful observation.

Year 2 wrapped up their *Artists as Explorers* unit by making meticulous observational drawings of natural artefacts, which they then transformed into striking wax-resist paintings and water soluble masterpieces!

Year 3 have enjoyed studying the painting *Penelope with the Suitors* by Pintoricchio. They explored printing techniques using polystyrene tiles and inks, and added a personal touch by overlaying their own handmade paper characters from the painting.

Years 4 and 5 have worked tirelessly on layered self-portraits inspired by artist Mike Barrett. By combining a variety of media, they created deeply personal and thought-provoking pieces that will make a fantastic display.

Year 6 have been diving into the concept of perspective. Their finished skyscraper artworks demonstrate both mathematical precision and artistic creativity — a truly brilliant combination!



Art in Reception and Y1- spirals and snails







Art Y2- Observational drawings and wax resists and water soluble pens.



Art- Y3 printing








Art - Y4/5 self portraits



Art- Y6 'Perspective' and clay invertebrates




Handwriting Information

Handwriting needs to be taught in a consistent way. From the earliest stages, children will be developing their fine motor skills when they pick up writing tools and make marks on paper. This should be encouraged, and opportunities provided for children to scribble, draw, colour and develop other early writing skills. However, it is important for children to develop good habits with writing, and pencil hold, and formation are important parts of this process. When your child starts to write, we would encourage you to reinforce the 'tripod' grip through modelling and correction where necessary. This pencil grip gives children the most control over the movement of their writing tool. When children are beginning to form letters, we encourage children to follow set formation. Once a child can form their letters correctly, joined writing is introduced. When starting to join, we encourage clear joins, which aid fluency and accuracy in writing.

Children are then taught to join their letters through a carefully structured programme called Nelson Handwriting. Here's some information you might find useful.

Children receive a 'pen licence' when they achieve the Thomas's Academy handwriting standard.






