


## September Attendance

Absence request forms must be completed by a parent/carer for ANY child, no matter their age





## Year 3 The Serge Hill Project Trip

Year 3 had a fantastic time on their trip to the Serge Hill Project. One of the highlights was making our own juice, which everyone thoroughly enjoyed! We also spent time exploring a wide variety of plants and seeds, learning how they grow and discovering just how many different types there are. The children were fascinated by the range of colours, shapes and textures and loved being able to see those things up close.

What made the trip even more special was the chance to spend the day outside London. Surrounded by open space, fresh air and greenery, the children experienced a completely different environment from their usual classroom setting. It was a wonderful opportunity not only to learn in new ways but also to appreciate the value of being outdoors.

We are so proud of how well behaved and enthusiastic Year 3 were throughout the day and delighted they returned with new knowledge, fresh inspiration and some truly memorable experiences! A huge thank you to our school gardener, Pascale, for helping to organise the trip.











## Art in September

We've had a wonderfully creative start to the term in Art across the school! Nursery children have been exploring a range of media to create different lines, shapes, and prints inspired by the colours and textures of Autumn. Reception and Year 1 have worked together to produce two stunning large-scale collaborative pieces – one celebrating the joyful story *Julian is a Mermaid* and the other inspired by the vibrant work of contemporary artist Rachel Jones. Year 2 have been thinking like artists and explorers, collecting natural materials from around the school grounds and using them to create beautiful, thoughtful installations in our very own Peace Garden. Year 3 have been exploring the theme of 'Shapes' and have taken on the challenge of 'drawing with scissors' – cutting out and arranging shapes to collaboratively recreate the Renaissance painting *Penelope and the Suitors*, inspired by a poem from Homer's *The Odyssey*. In Years 4 and 5, children have been developing their skills in portraiture, producing striking and expressive work inspired by the abstract style of Picasso. Finally, Year 6 have been mastering the art of perspective, creating detailed sketches using horizon lines and vanishing points to bring depth and realism to their compositions. It's been an exciting month full of imagination, exploration, and artistic achievement! Here is




## **Online Safety**








# Community Notices
