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# Head Teacher's Update

#### Dear Thomas's Academy Community,

I am delighted to share that we now have completed the IT upgrade of 5 classrooms during the holidays. Each of the classes has a brand new computer for the teacher and a new linked interactive screen for the class. The new equipment will significantly improve the teaching and learning experience. Thanks to the Thomas's IT team and maintenance team for installing these for us. We aim to complete the remaining 3 classrooms this month. We also have 30 brand new iPADs for use in school. These up to date IPADs will enable us to reconnect with an intervention APP we use called Lexia.

There will be a slight change to opening times of the main school in the morning. Previously, we opened the gates at 8.40am and the doors at 8.45am. Moving forward, we will open both at 8.45am to avoid families having to wait in the playground unnecessarily. The doors close at 8.55am. Late children should enter via the main office and be signed in by their parent. There are also some slight changes with staffing. Class teachers have sent a communication to families with all the relevant information.

We warmly welcome lots of new nursery children and their families starting Thomas's Academy this month. They join our thriving nursery with a waiting list. Please be reminded that the closing date for the reception application is 15th January. We are able to support parents and carers with the application process if necessary. We have 89 applications so are likely to have a waiting list.

We are looking forward to a busy half term and have lots of plans for children. Our INSET day on 6th January was spent focussing on pupil progress among other things. We track progress carefully and use this data to inform our teaching using a well-established process. If you have any questions about your child's progress, please reach out to your child's teacher.

Some ongoing activities include gardening sessions, swimming (now switching to year 3), parent story time, work with MIND and work with Chelsea Football Club. We have planned a number of trips including The National History Museum for Year 3, Guildhall Library for Year 5 and the Science Museum for Year 2 and 4 linked to their topics. There are also a number of author workshops planned for many of the classes. Please watch out for information about the Year 5/6 residential trip later in the year and the annual school sleepover for Year 4.

Coffee mornings are a new feature of our school. Please keep an eye on the school calendar (on the website) and other communications to keep up to date on these.

The PTA are busily planning for their next big event: The International Food Festival. This is always a highlight of the year. It provides an opportunity for us all to celebrate and share our national dishes and everyone is encouraged to take part.

Please do speak with me or another member of staff if you have any concerns. Wishing everyone a wonderful start to the new year.

Please note that we are obliged to contact the Local Authority if a pupil has unauthorised absences that equate to more than 10% within a ten-week period. This route will result in a Penalty Notice (PN) being issued or a referral to Family Services.

If there is a reason for your child to be absent, for example sickness or medical appointments, please email <u>absent@academy.thomas-s.co.uk</u>. For absence requests, a form can be collected from the school office for Miss Kelly to consider.

**Punctuality is also incredibly important**. The classrooms open at 8.45am at which point children enter and engage with learning activities - these tend to be maths revision and challenges to support children's retention of maths learning. The register is taken at 8.55am after which point children are marked late. School doors close at this time and children will only be able to enter via the front office.

Late children should be brought into the school (not left at the gate) so parents/carers can sign children in late. This is to ensure that children are safely handed over.

Children should be collected promptly at the end of their school day. Any parent collecting after being 10 minutes late, their child will be sent to Shine Bright Club and parents/carers may be charged a minimum fee of £10.

#### Year 5's Visit to the National Physical Laboratory Science Show

On Friday 13th December, Year 5 went to St Paul's School to watch a science show with two scientists from the National Physical Laboratory. It was all about liquid nitrogen. The scientists (a man and a woman) performed lots of different experiments.

One of my favourites was the demonstration to show how temperature affects physical properties. The scientists took a tennis bounce ball, bounced it on the floor to show it was bouncy. Then they put it in a bucket full of liquid nitrogen and when they took it out, it didn't bounce anymore! This is because liquid nitrogen is extremely cold- 196 °C.

The science show was really fun and we had a great time! I learnt lots of new things and it was really cool to see liquid nitrogen in real life.




## Learn to Learn
