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

Head Teacher's Update



Dear Thomas's Academy Community,

I have to start by congratulating everyone involved in this year's sports day. It was a huge success. Thanks in particular to the staff who helped us from other schools including Thomas's Clapham, Thomas's Fulham and Fulham Boys School. It is always so lovely to work with other schools. Thanks also to Ms Thompson, our PE teacher, who was involved in much of the preparation. Well done, finally, to the children at Thomas's Academy; I was so impressed with the sportsmanship and sense of fun that was on display.

I wanted to share with you how proud we are of our end of year results. Year 4 in particular have given us reason for celebration. In their multiplication tables check (statutory assessment) 100% of children scored over 20/25. Further, 67% scored full marks (last year 34% of pupils nationally scored full marks)! This is an incredible achievement - well done all!

In addition, I wanted to share that Thomas's Academy won the Colet Club Maths Competition at St Paul's School. Our Year 5's competed against lots of other schools (from Years' 5 and 6). The competition included high level challenges such as a cross number and a relay, testing their reasoning, algebra, arithmetic and problem solving skills. Some rounds were timed, meaning they had to think fast and work as a team under pressure. They showed fantastic teamwork and determination throughout and we couldn't be prouder.

I'm aware that everyone is keen to know the plans for next year. I thought I would begin with sharing information about those staff who are moving on from Thomas's Academy. Far fewer staff are moving on this year which is great for us as a school working on building on the wonderful elements we have created.

Clare Wood, our assistant head, has been at the school since 2018. She is moving to progress her career after having been here so long. We thank her for her years of dedication to the school and for the improvements she has made, specifically to our English Curriculum. Yasmin Mohammed, our nursery teacher, is moving also. Yasmin also joined us in 2018. Yasmin is keen to broaden her experience. We are immensely proud of Yasmin's journey and wish her all the best for her career. Mr Peters has completed his apprenticeship year with us and will begin his teaching career at a school in North London. He has made a significant contribution to the school in the year he has been here and we wish him the best with his new role. Ms Ayishat Ajikobi, our SBM, has completed her maternity cover role and will be moving on to do teacher training. She has been incredibly helpful in so many ways ensuring the school runs smoothly. We thank, also, Ms Bonnici who was here on a temporary basis and is planning to enjoy some well-deserved travelling and Ms Thompson who has been teaching PE this year and did such a wonderful job with the Sports Day.

The annual transition day will be on 11th July. This is when children get to spend time with their new teacher in their new classroom. Nursery and Reception teachers are announced as Ms Buyson in nursery and Ms Pownall in reception - both excellent existing members of staff. We have decided to announce this early to support with the transition of the many new families joining us. We will be announcing the remaining class teachers on 11th July. We will be working hard to ensure that staff are given thorough handovers in order that each child's journey can be supported and children will get opportunities to familiarise themselves with their new environment and adults and any other changes such as the routines of the day or changes in uniform (Y4 to Y5).

As our consultation to join Quality First Education has now closed, the school governors are busily working through the responses and will be in touch with an update shortly.

We love to support our community and, of course, are always looking for ways to increase our income. To achieve this, we have a number of current lettings arrangements including the wonderful Fulham Farmers' Market. Did you know we also let out the building? Please see our new lettings tab on our website and share this information with anyone relevant. Whilst you're at it, please take the time to look through our website which has undergone many updates.

On a personal note, I am really proud that the school Irish Dancing group are again performing at this year's Parsons Green Fair on 5th July. Please do come and show your support; we're performing at 3pm.




June Attendance



Colet Club Maths Challenge- Monday 9th June 2025

Some of our pupils in Years 5 and 6 have been taking part in Colet Club, which is a lunchtime maths club that explores fun and challenging mathematical problems. On Monday 9th June, a group of Year 5 pupils represented Thomas's Academy at the Colet Club Maths Challenge, held at St Paul's School. Unfortunately, the Year 6 pupils couldn't attend as they were away on another school trip.

The competition brought together teams from a number of primary schools and featured a variety of challenging rounds such as crossnumbers, shuttle relays, and logic puzzles – all designed to test teamwork and advanced problem-solving skills. Some rounds were timed and included topics such as algebra, factorisation and tricky number sequences, pushing pupils well beyond the Year 5 curriculum.

We are absolutely thrilled to announce that the team from Thomas's Academy WON the competition! It was a demanding challenge and our pupils demonstrated impressive perseverance, collaboration and mathematical thinking. We are incredibly proud of them! A huge well done to our brilliant young mathematicians!





What have we been up to in Nursery?

We've had such a fantastic month in Nursery, filled with fun, learning, and creativity! Our theme has been *Traditional Tales*, and the children have really enjoyed exploring these magical stories. We began with **The Three Little Pigs**, focusing on materials and using key vocabulary such as *strong* and *weak*. The children loved experimenting with different materials to see if they could be blown down—just like in the story! Our **Talk for Writing (T4W)** story this half term is *The Gingerbread Man*. The children have had so much fun creating and decorating their own gingerbread men using playdough—it's been a real treat!

Another exciting theme this term has been **jungle** animals. Our Animal-Themed Tea Party was an absolute hit! It was wonderful to see so many parents joining us—thank you for your generous donations and all the effort put into the food. We also read *The Tiger Who Came to Tea* by Judith Kerr and *Walking Through the Jungle* by Debbie Harter, learning all about animals and their jungle habitats.

In **Maths**, we've now covered numbers up to 10 and are working on the concepts of *one more* and *one less* within that range.

As part of our **Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED)**, we've been focusing on solving conflicts and practising how to use gentle hands when playing with our friends.

Thank you for your continued support—we're so proud of all the progress the children are making!









What have we been up to in Reception?

Reception have had a busy month! We began the month by exploring the topic of 'Summer', where we learnt about seasonal clothing and popular activities such as going on picnics, holidays and visits to the seaside. The children enjoyed our focus on Van Gogh, creating their own beautiful sunflowers inspired by his work. We next moved on to our topic of 'Minibeasts'. The children learnt about what they look like and where they live. A special highlight was observing the life cycle of our very own class caterpillars. This was an amazing opportunity to see nature in action! This tied in perfectly with our outdoor learning session where the children went on a minibeast hunt and took turns leading the class on a specially designed trail. The month concluded with the much anticipated Sports Day. The children showed fantastic skill, enthusiasm and sportsmanship, cheering one another on and making us proud! What a fantastic month, Reception!













What have we been up to in Year 1?

What a truly wonderful term we've had together! It's been a joy to see the children flourish—here are some of the highlights we've all enjoyed:

🐞 Outdoor Learning

We embraced the outdoors as our very own classroom! The children donned their explorer hats and set off on a 'minibeast adventure'. Their excitement and curiosity while observing nature firsthand was fantastic to witness.

🎭 Jack and the Beanstalk Assembly

Our class gave a spirited performance of *Jack and the Beanstalk*, showcasing both their singing talents and their grasp of storytelling. They took great pride in their lines, props, and singing—and they also shared their wonderful writing and science experiments with the audience, sharing their creativity and enthusiasm.

Learning to Write Reports

This term, Year 1 delved into the world of non-chronological reports. They learned to structure their writing with clear headings, subheadings, and factual information. We can't wait to share our wonderful reports with you soon!









What have we been up to in Year 2?

What a busy and exciting time we've had in Year 2!

It's hard to believe that we're nearing the end of our time in Year 2 - we're definitely ready for the challenges and adventures of Year 3!

Recently, we performed our class assembly, where we reflected on our school values. We hope you enjoyed it as much as we enjoyed preparing it! We've also been making the most of our Outdoor Learning sessions — take a look at us in action!

In Maths, we've been exploring measurement. We had great fun estimating and comparing capacities by pouring and experimenting with different containers.

Although we love reading with Year 6, we recently did something a bit different - some junk modelling! We worked together to recreate Thomas's Academy building using recycled materials. It was creative, collaborative, and lots of fun!









What have we been up to in Year 3?

We've had an exciting and enriching June in Year 3, packed with learning adventures and creative achievements!

In *Geography*, the children have been exploring Fulham, focusing on land use and identifying both physical and human features. Our fieldwork visit around the area brought this learning to life, and the children thoroughly enjoyed comparing maps of Fulham from 1865, 1915, and the present day to see how our neighbourhood has changed over time.

Music has taken us on a journey to India! We've been listening to traditional Indian music, learning to identify instruments such as the sitar, and even composed our own *Rag* melodies using xylophones — a wonderful blend of rhythm and creativity.

Sports Day was a real highlight! Despite the heat, the children showed fantastic resilience and sportsmanship, cheering each other on and competing with great respect and enthusiasm.

In *Writing*, we've been diving into imaginative storytelling through our work on *warning tales*. Inspired by "*The Tear Thief*" by Carol Ann Duffy, the children created their own stories featuring a thief of their choice. These tales have been such a joy to read — full of creativity, suspense, and brilliant language use. I'm incredibly proud of the effort and originality they've shown.

To round off the term, we visited *The British Museum* in late June. The children explored exhibits on Ancient Egypt, Romans in Britain, the Rosetta Stone, and the Stone, Bronze and Iron Ages. It was a truly fantastic day full of curiosity and awe — and we're already planning our return next year!



What have we been up to in Year 4?

What an exciting and inspiring time we've had in Year 4!

It's hard to believe that our Year 4 journey is almost coming to an end — we're certainly ready for the new challenges and responsibilities of Year 5!

This month, we became passionate conservationists, exploring how we can protect our environment and reduce the impact of coral bleaching, plastic pollution and deforestation.

In History, we've been delving into the fascinating world of the Ancient Maya and their many inventions.

The children have begun writing speeches to explain how these inventions have influenced modern society — we can't wait to hear them!

In Writing, we've been learning the art of persuasion. We began by discussing the importance of rivers, and then children chose their own persuasive topics — from having shorter school days to banning smoking and vaping. After researching, planning and drafting, they produced some fantastic persuasive texts that we're sure would convince anyone!

We finished the month with an exciting Outdoor Learning session, where we worked in teams to complete a series of teamwork and problem-solving challenges. Well done to everyone for showing such brilliant collaboration and resilience!















What have we been up to in Year 5?

It's been a busy and exciting month for Year 5! We've had lots of fantastic learning opportunities both inside and outside the classroom.

At the start of the month, we went on a brilliant trip to Pizza Express. When we arrived, we were warmly welcomed by the Restaurant Manager and their team. First, we learned some important cooking basics, like how to wash our hands properly and stay safe in the kitchen. Then, the pizzaiolo (pizza chef) showed us how to make a classic Italian Margherita pizza. We all had the chance to knead the dough and shape it into a perfect base before adding our toppings of tomato sauce and mozzarella. After all that hard work, we headed to Bishop's Park to enjoy our delicious pizzas and we had a great time playing together.

We also loved our visit to the Barnes Literature Festival, where we took part in an interactive storytelling adventure with author Katya Balen. It was an imaginative session that really brought reading to life!

Back in school, we've been learning all about desert biomes in Geography. We've particularly enjoyed researching these unique environments and presenting our home learning projects to the class!

What have we been up to in Art?


In art, we have been busy preparing for July's Whole School Exhibition!


