What Animal Are You?

We'll be discovering:

- About animals and their habitats
- How to sort living things into different groups
- What a micro-habitat is and what creatures live there
- How animals are adapted to their environment
- How living things depend on each other

What Makes a House a Home?

We'll investigate:

- How to compare the lives of two different famous people from the past
- About the achievements of important scientists and inventors
- About what life was like at different times in the past

In PE, we'll be practising our ball skills by learning to dribble, pass and catch a ball. After half term we''' be practising how to strike a ball when playing net and wall games.

Our **RE** focus this term is Islam

In **Character Curriculum** we'll be talking about our Dreams and Goals and learning how we can lead a healthy lifestyle.

In **Computing**, we will be exploring algorithms through a variety of cross curricular unplugged activities. We will also discover some opportunities for digital programming during busy learning.

In **English** we will be:

We will then look at the structure of a story and begin putting our sentences together to make our own version of Elmer.

In **Maths** we will be learning about:

- Exploring calculation strategies within 20.
- Numbers to 50.
- Exploring calculation strategies within 50.

In **Spanish,** we will: TOPIC I: Los Colores

Learn to recognise and recall colours.

TOPIC 2 : Los Animales

Learn to recognise and recall common animals. Use colours to describe animals putting adjective before noun. Book 'Oso Pardo' de Eric Carle

In **Art** this term Year I will start by exploring the theme of mythology through 3D and digital art. They will experiment with building models out of various materials and develop skills in construction techniques. Digital art made on iPads will also be created throughout the term.
