Reminders for this term:

- Children can arrive at school from 8.4-Oam. They walk into school via the door situated to the right of the school office entrance. Registration is completed at 8.55am Please ensure that your child is here on time every day.

In our Science topic, we'll be finding out:

- . How life began in the sea then came out of the sea
- How fossils provide information about living things from the past
- Why the dinosaurs died out
- About the classification of plants and animals
- How plants and animals reproduce
- How living things evolve and change over time
- How plants and animals are adapted to their environment
- How adaptation leads to evolution



Our RE focus this term is Islam

In History, we'll be finding out:

- What life was like in Britain in AD900
- Who were the Vikings?
- Differences between Britain in AD900 and a non -European society in AD900
- About the Maya from the buildings and artefacts they left behind
- How the Maya worshipped their gods
- How the Maya used glyphs for writing and counting
- Why the Maya empire declined

In Spanish we will be learning:

TOPIC I: Telling the time

TOPIC 2: La comida We will be learning the names of different drinks and snacks, how to ask for them and pay in euros

TOPIC 3: los instrumentos

We will be learning the names of different instuments, saying which instruments you like/dislike and using the verb "tocar"

In Art, Year 5 will be working with textiles. They will look at prints from around the world and identify the similarities and differences that they find. Using what they discover they will create their own print designs and experiment with manipulating fabrics.

We already know the interest you take in your child's work. If you can, please discuss with your child the work they have done as the term progresses and let them teach you. If your child has some work to research, please help them, but without actually doing the work.

In **English** we will be focusing on developing our spelling, punctuation and grammar skills through narrative and non-fiction writing.

- We will be working in SPAG groups 3 times a week to address gaps in understanding
- We will be participating in whole class reading sessions twice a week to continue developing our VIPERS skills (vocabulary, inference, prediction, explain, retrieval and summarise)
- We will be using the Anglo-Saxon legend 'Beowulf' to develop our descriptive writing, focusing on describing characters and using different writing techniques to improve the cohesion of our writing.

In **Maths** we will be covering the topics of fractions & decimals, angles, fractions & percentages and transformations.

- For fractions & decimals, pupils will focus on the equivalence of fractions and decimals.
 They will be introduced to numbers with up to three decimal places, extending to thousandths and relating them to tenths and hundredths.
- For angles, pupils will learn how to use a protractor to measure and draw angles in degrees. Pupils will identify that angles at a point total 360° and that angles at a point on a straight line total 180° .
- For fractions and percentages, pupils will calculate with fractions starting with addition
 and subtraction and moving on to multiplying a fraction and a whole number. They
 will come to understand that percentages, decimals and fractions are different ways of
 expressing proportions.
- For transformations, pupils will identify, describe and represent the position of a shape following a translation or a reflection and known that the shape has not changed.

In **Computing** we will be learning to:

- design, write and debug programs that accomplish specific goals, including controlling or simulating physical systems; solve problems by decomposing them into smaller parts
- use sequence, selection, and repetition in programs; work with variables and various forms of input and output
- use logical reasoning to explain how some simple algorithms work and to detect and correct errors in algorithms and programs
