This term we will be learning how we can create the illusion of perspective in our artwork. We will explore how this can be done through drawing, photog-

n **Music** Year 6 will Combining musical songs and rhythms with basic music theory content along with some instruments too.

- In **Computing** we will be learning about: Online communication
- We will learn about the World Wide Web as a communication tool. We will learn how we find information on the World Wide Web, through learning how search engines work (including how they select and rank results) and what influences searching.

In English, we will be focusing on increasing our writing stamina and understanding effective writing to suit audience and purpose. We will be using a range of different writing types such as balanced argument and description and work closely on grammatical features which are key to these writing types such as: subordinate clauses, fronted adverbials and correct subject and verb agreement through tenses. For our non-fiction writing we will be working on the use of subject specific vocabulary to inform the reader as well as accurate use on non-fiction features such as headings and sub-headings, 3rd person and expanded noun-phrases.

There will be continuing focus on Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar throughout all of our English learning as well as daily reading lessons in which Year 6 will be exposed to high quality texts and extracts to support their reading development and comprehension abilities. In Maths we will be learning to:

- Read, write, order and compare numbers up to 10 000 000 and determine the value of each digit
- Solve problems involving addition and subtraction
- Solve addition and subtraction multi-step problems in contexts, deciding which operations and methods to use and why
- Identify the value of each digit in numbers given to three decimal places and multiply and divide numbers by 10, 100 and 1000 giving answers up to three decimal places
- Use estimation to check answers to calculations
- Multiply multi-digit numbers up to 4 digits by a two-digit whole number using the formal written method of long multiplication
- Multiply one-digit numbers with up to two decimal places by whole numbers .
