We are so glad you are coming back, we've missed you! The expectations for the return to school are:

What will we be learning?

In Science, we'll be finding out:

- How we hear sounds and see light
- How the human ear and eye works
- How sound and light waves travel
- How materials affect the quality of sound
- How we can change the pitch of sounds
- About how we see light and it's reflections

In **PE**, we'll be doing lessons focussing on Agility, Balance & Coordination (A, B,C's).

In English we will be learning about: Macbeth

We will be focusing on one of Shakespeare's greatest plays and looking really closely and how dialogue is used within it. Macbeth is a wishing tale (when someone wants something badly). We will be innovating the story of Macbeth to create our own wishing tale based around school. Hopefully we will include lots of quality dialogue to advance the story and portray characters feelings/ emotions.

In Maths we will be learning about:

- Fractions
- Decimals and measure
- Percentages and statistics

In Art...

Year 6 will investigate how sculptors use scale and gesture to represent ideas/emotions. They will create a figure using measurement, gesture as symbol (Gormley & Attia) & modelling techniques. They will use a 'green screen' to expand on outcomes.

In Spanish we will be learning:

El Tiempo

- Study the seasons
- Learn the location of major Spanish cities
- Prepare and present a weather forecast

In **Music,** we'll be:

- Understanding rhythm and pulse
- Improvising rhythmic patterns
