



In our <u>History</u> topic <u>How have children's lives changed?</u> we will be learning about:

- The working lives of Tudor children
- The working lives of Victorian children
- The changes that were put in place to support children by Lord Shaftesbury
- How children's leisure time has changed over time.
- The diseases that were caught by children over time and how they were treated.

In our Geography topic <u>Why are rainforests important to us?</u>
we will be learning about:



- The characteristics of the layers of a tropical rainforest.
- The lives of indigenous people in the Amazon rainforest.
- Why rainforests are important and understand the threats to the Amazon.
- How local woodland is used through data collection methods.
- Analysing and presenting findings on how local woodland is used.

English

Our Autumn 1 Talk for Writing focus text is *The Day the Crayons Quit* where we will be learning to write a letter, with a focus on punctuation and adjectives. During Autumn 2 our focus text is *The Firework Maker's Daughter* where we will be writing a setting description that is inclusive of descriptive vocabulary and cohesive sentence structure.

Our core reading texts are *The Firework Maker's Daughter* (Aut 1) and *There's a Boy in the Girls Bathroom* (Aut 2) which will be use to help develop our reading skills.

<u>Maths</u>

- Reasoning with large numbers (4-digit place value, 10, 100 or 1000 more or less, rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 or 1000)
- Addition and subtraction (selecting appropriate strategies to add and subtract, reasoning and problem solving whilst using strategies including column method and regrouping.
- Multiplication and division (patterns in multiplication tables, multiplying three 1-digit numbers, mental multiplication and division strategies, short multiplication)
- Discrete and continuous data (Read, interpret and construct pictograms, bar charts and time graphs. Compare tables, pictograms and bar charts)

Music

South Africa- Whole-class instrumental lessons on tuned percussion. This South Africa-themed unit develops pupils' rhythmic, singing and notation skills.

Singing- Children will develop their singing technique. Learning to keep in time and work on musical notation and rhythm.

Art

The class will be studying Portraits. Looking closely at proportions of the head, self portraits and developing their skills of observation. The children will study artists such as Pablo Picasso, Henri Matisse, Gwen John and Frieda Kahlo.

In <u>Character Curriculum,</u> we will be learning about: Being Me in My World & Celebrating Differences

In <u>PE</u>, we will be learning about: Health related fitness - how doing sports keeps our bodies and minds healthy through games and circuits and how we can improve our fitness long term and short term. Next half term we will be looking at netball/basketball.

Dance - we will develop and enhance our dance skills and create routines. Swimming- children will continue to learn a range of swimming techniques.
